- 2. What is the significance of the conch Shell?
- 3. Jack is unable to kill the pig at this point. What does this reveal about Jack? What does his comment about the next time foreshadow?

Chapter 2 "Fire on the Mountain"

- 4. What rules do the boys set down for the group?
- 5. By the end of chapter 2 who do you think is the wisest of the boys? Why?

Chapter 3 "Huts on the Beach"

6. In chapter 3 William Golding says "They looked at each other, baffled, in love and hate." Who is he talking about and what does it mean?

7. Give several events that led to •the argument between Ralph and Jack.
