Part 2: Short Response

Part 3: Essay

In House Arrest by K.A. Holt, Timothy makes several important choices that lead him ultimately to juvie, but which also lead to Levi getting the care he needs. In To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee, Atticus makes the decision to defend Tom Robinson even though he knows he will ultimately lose.

In an essay of at least 3 well-developed paragraphs, discuss the significance of the choices that Timothy and Atticus in both House Arrest and To Kill a Mockingbird must make.
