

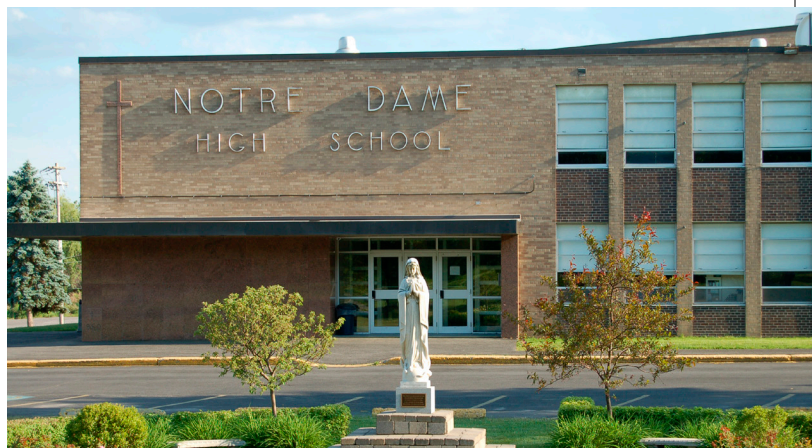

ALUMNI DOING OUTSTANDING THINGS

Nancy Doolen Robert received The 2023 YWCA Mohawk Valley Salute to Outstanding Women Award for work for Social Justice in the community.

Nancy is very active at Mother Marianne's West Side Soup Kitchen. The Mother Marianne's West Side Kitchen located on Columbia Street in Utica provides hot meals to struggling families and individuals, the unemployed, and the homeless. The soup kitchen is named after Utica, NY's first and only saint – Mother Marianne Cope, who grew up in the parish before becoming a Franciscan sister.

In 2018 Nancy and her sister, Patricia Doolen McCraith (St. Francis DeSales Class 1969) opened the Mother Marianne's West Side Boutique and Hair Salon. The team of volunteers help over 250 people monthly, including the homeless, working poor, refugees, families in shelters, and others. Everyone is treated with kindness, dignity, respect and compassion.

Nancy Doolen Robert is doing God's work.

"For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me." Heather Hage received The YWCA Mohawk Valley Salute to Outstanding Women Award for her contributions to STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics in the community. Heather is president and CEO of the Griffiss Institute in Rome; a complex, tech-savvy organization that develops technologies for the Department of Defense and adapts new technologies to commercial applications.

Heather believes we are more successful when we all work together. "Scientists and engineers rarely innovate alone the products and services that shape our world. Technology innovation requires designers, lawyers, janitors, marketers, accountants, and others." Heather feels the Mohawk Valley has the potential to become a nationally renowned destination for future scientists, engineers, entrepreneurs, and beyond.

"And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." — Romans 8:28

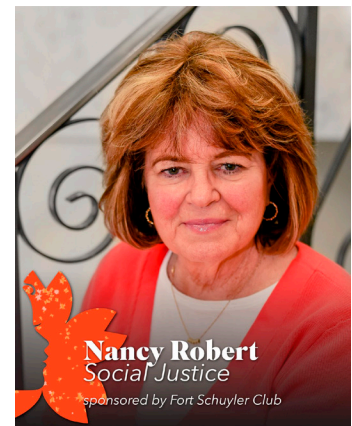
On May 20, 2023, Bishop Douglas J. Lucia celebrated the ordination to the Sacred Order of Deacon for **Benjamin Joseph Schrantz**.

While completing his undergraduate degree at SUNY Fredonia, Deacon Ben Schrantz credits the Newman Center's sense of family and community for his growth as a young Catholic. "The community quickly became my second family." Deacon Ben planned to earn a master's degree in library science but his experience at the Newman Center placed a "kernel" in his heart that perhaps God was calling him to travel another path.

"God speaks to us in the silence of our hearts," said Deacon Ben. "To find where God is calling us, we need to enter into that silence and follow the peace that comes from it. When you allow him to work in your heart, he will fill your life with an abundance of grace and peace."

Deacon Ben said the promises he made as a transitional deacon — a life of service to the Church and her people — are the building blocks for his future ordination to the priesthood.

In August, he will return to the Theological College in Washington D.C. to complete his final year of seminarian studies. Deacon Ben will be ordained to the priesthood in the Syracuse Diocese in June 2024. May God bless him on his journey.

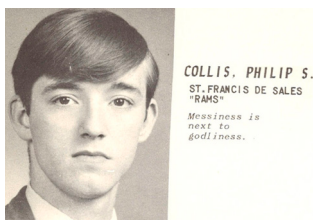
